You're in your dining room, on the train or hunched over your seven-year old's bedroom table turned into "home office". You're on your device. Wherever you are, grab a seat.


Most of the events are on **www.wordtravels.info.** You purchase a ticket. A door opens to a hidden stage with live digital events and a library of powerful videos.
